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Passover Podcast Notes

The year of Messiahs death and resurrection is most likely 30 CE/AD.

Pachat/ Scriptural Proof

- ✧ 30 CE/AD is the only plausible year. It's the ONLY feast calendar that lines up with every gospel account and timeline.
- ✧ When using 30 CE as the year of Messiahs Passover all apparent "inconsistencies" disappear.

Prophetic Proof

- ✧ Daniel 9 states that this
"Seventy weeks are decreed about your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to put an end to sin, and to atone for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal both vision and prophet, and to anoint a most holy place."

That is exactly 483 years and ends exactly at 27 CE/AD exactly the time of Yeshuas Mikvah- add to that His 3 years of ministry and you're at 30 CE/AD

Historical Proof

- ✧ Talmud tells of these occurrences 40 years before the Temples destruction in 70 CE.
 - The Shekinah lifted from the temple
 - The western light (the Menorah) went out – The Menorah has always been known as a symbol of Messiah
 - These occurrences all fall on 30 CE

Please note: that these are only 2 of many unusual events that the Rabbis of the Talmud say occur that year

On What day was Messiah put to death?

(Please see attached timeline)

- ✧ It's important to note Passover is the only feast that does not begin at sundown on the previous day. It begins at dusk (between the evenings) at the end of Nissan 14th.
- ✧ On Nissan 14 we see Messiahs talmidim ask "shall we go and prepare the Pesach for you?" He says yes. They begin their Seder on Nissan 14 at dusk. It is after sundown on the 15th that he goes to the garden and is betrayed and taken.
- ✧ His execution begins at 9 Am on Nissan 15 dies at 3 Pm and is buried before sundown.

- ✧ Moving Messiahs execution to the proper day also eliminates all the common issues people have with Johns account.
- ✧ Please note that at the Exodus Israel was not freed until Nissan 15th, the only thing that occurred on the 14 was the humane sacrifice of the lamb.
 - The lamb represents a most revered god of Egypt. It was so revered that it was illegal to kill them.
 - Exodus 8:22 says “For what we will sacrifice to Hashem our Lord is sacred to the Egyptians”

Messiah Resurrects Shabbat or Sunday

- ✧ Messiah died on (Thursday) Nissan 15 30 CE and arose on the first day of the week (Sunday) Firstfruits.
- ✧ Could it be that he rose “on the third day” as we see in other places in scripture?
 - Yeshua gives the sign of Jonah – “3 days and 3 nights” not the sign of Joseph – “on the third day”.
- ✧ The Aramaic transcripts clearly says that Yeshua arose on the first day of the week (John 20)
- ✧ Could it be that Messiah arose just before the end of Shabbat?
 - Scriptures say that “the women rested for the sake of the commandment” (a phrase used to describe the WEEKLY Sabbath). Then as they approach the tomb of Messiah the sun is rising and they feel an earthquake. This (by our reckoning) is very likely the time of Yeshuas resurrection. Would it not make sense that the earth quaked at His death and then again at His resurrection?
