Lazy Laity

One of the main thrusts of Jewish Law is to have at least a couple witnesses and to investigate a matter thoroughly. Sadly, this is not always upheld not only in Judaism but in Christianity as well.

In Judaism many Jews rely on what the Rabbi's and Sages say without thoroughly seeking out a matter on their own. The most obvious issue this seems to be true is that of Yeshua being the Messiah. Most Jews are fearful of researching un-bias the information on their own and accept pad answers given by anti-missionaries or the view given by their Rabbi or sect Rebbe. I'm not saying blindly accept the Christians "facts" that proclaim Yeshua as Messiah, but take all views and opinions into account and weight it all out. Look at religion, customs, history, apologetics, all the pro's and con's and prayerfully consider the information before you.
